Coordinator's Summary for 2018

Grants

Grant timeline will remain focused around a March deadline and an April reveal. 2018's six grants totaled \$16,178! Since the inception of the Foundation in 2007, sixty seven grants totaling \$199, 619.13 have been given to teachers and students and campus projects at LISD campuses.

On April 30, 2108, The Liberty ISD Education Foundation announced 2018's grant winners. Three educators from Liberty Elementary School Oriana Cedeño, Andrea Hagan and Whitney Cain Shaw will be enjoying grants funded by the Liberty ISD Education Foundation. Two grants were awarded to Liberty Middle School teachers; Elisha Lemelle and Angela Brooks while Carlene Patton garnered one for the San Jacinto Elementary campus. The six Innovative teaching grants projects funded in 2018's cycle are listed below by campus:

Liberty Elementary School

When I grow up, I want to become... – Oriana Cedeño \$778.20

This grant creates an opportunity for 5th grade bilingual class to write and print a book about career choices. This grant is funded in part by The Dahlia McManus Endowment and The Laura Jane Hartel Endowment.

Pedal to Success – Andrea Hagan

\$2,693.95

P.R.I.D.E. program will phase in under-desk pedal exercisers to help address some disruptive behavior. This grant will phase in these exercisers as needed. This grant is funded in part by The CW and Aggie Castle Family Endowment, The JoAnn McGuire Endowment, the C.A. (Abe) Miles Endowment, The Liberty County Farm Bureau Endowment and The Nora Miles Endowment.

Egg Incubation 4.10 C – Whitney Cain Shaw

\$555

This grant will help students explore, illustrate and compare life cycles of living organisms. This grant is funded in part by The Mildred Arnold Endowment and The Liberty Lions Club.

Liberty Middle School

Futuristic Architecture – Angela Brooks

\$1477

Art class tackles engineering, design and construction of famous structures. Students will create new structures as well using foam board and other materials. This grant is funded by The JoBeth Willoughby Teaching Grant, The Miles Foundation and the M.J. Joe Leonard Endowment.

Creating Tomorrow's STEM
Leaders Today – Elisha
Lemelle \$7010

This grant utilizes DIVE-in engineering curriculum to enable students to deconstruct, evaluate and reconstruct real-world solutions. Project can include hovercrafts, subwoofers and more. This grant is funded by The Jeffrey Family Teaching Endowment, The Baxter W. Dunagan, Sr. Endowment, The Norman and Brenda Dykes Endowment and The Dr. Reese and Sara Brown Endowment.

Fundraising

The 3rd Liberty Freedom **Ride** was held involving 100 participants, over 75 volunteers but was severely affected by weather. Our packet pick-up remained at Chili's along with a Chili's Gives Back night at the restaurant. This approach to packet pickup has much room for fun and growth. A better location may be sought, somewhere like 10 de Mayo on Hwy 90. LFR cleared \$6,343 after entry fees and sponsorships.

Handbag Raffle income was

\$11,500. Although only 115 of 500 tickets were sold, we still believe that this will be a successful fundraiser. Week one saw our first winner Lakin Thomkins!

LISD Payroll Deduction

Program continues with \$3,684 last year. We continue to use the "Get on the Bus" tshirt strategy. All employees contributing to the payroll deduction campaign regardless of amount will be given a t-shirt with "Get on the Bus" on the front and "I support the Liberty ISD Education Foundation" on the back. They were able to wear their shirt and jeans on Fridays at most campuses. Mitzi, Leslie, D-Ann and Bruce went around to the campuses and explained the program and the goals of the Foundation. 64 LISD staffers are now contributing @ \$304/month to the program.

Other fundraising efforts added this year included a #GivingTuesday Facebook effort and Amazon.Smile.com.

Finance/Fundraising **Approach**

We contacted many former donors through mail outs and email which resulted in some donations but we should also develop new potential donors through directors' contacts. This year, significant effort was given to Huntington Ingalls Industry, The Temple Foundation and the Miles Foundation grant applications. These efforts proved to be very much worth our time.

What we have learned:

Challenges/Needs for 2019 -

The next items are my assessment of our needs and challenges:

Strategic Planning

Our calendar includes a work flow, showing what we should be doing at what point in the year. In developing the calendar, I considered other major events and fundraisers in Liberty avoiding what

well. Whether concerts, dances or raffles, we routinely have tickets unsold. Our current raffle left 80% of the tickets unsold. There are many possible reasons: ambitious event, pricing, competition for finite resources of potential donors. Regardless, these fundraisers lead to worries of breaking even and a lot of pressure to sell. Some believe this leads to a negative feeling at our meetings.

In 2014, We made a concerted effort to move toward ticketed events to try to spread the funding out to new people instead of the same donors. We moved away from the traditional personal contact/ presentation approach to fundraising.

Solution: After seeing results with the Miles Foundation and Huntington Ingalls Industry, the ROI of time of our directors may be best spent in targeted efforts to connect with potential donors. Return to a community campaign/traditional fundraising program
